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Principal's Report...

Dear Parents, Students and Community Members,

With the holidays fast approaching it is timely to make students aware of the **potential risks** they face irrespective of age.

Stranger Danger – whilst we are lucky to live in a community where most people know each other I would like to remind all students and in particular our younger children it is not appropriate to accept a "lift' in a motor vehicle or be walked home by any person you do not know. For our older students, parties have become fairly common practice – please ensure appropriate supervision is on site and it may be sensible to advise Tasmania Police of your intentions. Finally I urge all students to wear safety equipment [life jackets, helmets etc] as the weather allows us all to get involved in outdoor recreational activities.

It would appear that the primary building project, funded through the **Building Education Revolution** initiative is about to get underway. The P/I terrapin is due for removal by the end of the week. The plan is to replace this room with a new double building, construct a covered deck with independent access to each room along the front of the primary block and then complete the flexible learning areas on the southern side. An exiting time certainly awaits us!

Thank you to the families who attended **parent-teacher meetings**. Feedback was most positive and this partnership can only support student learning outcomes. Please remember that should you have any concerns about your child's progress please contact me and a meeting will be arranged so as to address the issue. For students who participated in Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 national testing in literacy and numeracy [NAPLAN] information will be available in the first week of Term 3.

Similarly I would like to thank the many community members who have willingly given up their time to participate in our **mock interview programme**. This is an invaluable part of our Grade 10 Pathways Programme and provides wonderful authentic learning opportunities.

Nic Wardlaw and Eliza Spykers have again kindly offered to coordinate the **East Coast choir.** Teachers are currently putting the programme together and rehearsals have been scheduled for Term 3 along with a number of public performances. This will provide a wonderful opportunity for many of our Grade 3-6 students to perform with their peers, from other schools, in our cluster. I hope the choir can be a key part of our end of year Presentation Assembly.



The College had friendly students on site to help us around the stair filled buildings; at midday we all met in the Hall to collect information on future classes and got to talk to possible future teachers.


