2010 STUDENT INFORMATION VALIDATION FORMS

All students received an Information Validation Form with their stationery at book sales this year. We ask that you make any required changes to your child's details and return the form to school as soon as possible ensuring that you have signed the form in the section titled verification of enrolment information at the end of the form. A guide to the Annual Validation Form published by the Education Department is available from the office, if you require further information about the process.

The annual validation form:

Schools and colleges are required to provide parents, guardians and independent students with this validation form each year or after the student changes school. The forms allow you to check our information and make any corrections or additions. Information about parents, guardians and the student is vital to us. Correct personal, emergency and medical information is needed to make sure that we look after students in a responsible manner. You may be contacted by us to provide additional or missing information.

Questions you might have:

What if my details change after this?

If any information changes, you should notify us. Separate forms are available to change either the student's name, personal details or medical conditions.

Why do I need to provide details of my background on the enrolment form?

The Federal Government now requires schools to provide a greater level of information. This form includes the details for national reporting. This information is used to measure the achievements of students from various backgrounds. Individuals are not identified. These new measures have been put in place to ensure that student performance is not unduly influenced by socioeconomic background or other student characteristics and to promote an education system that is fair for all Australian students.

Other important information we would like you be aware of:

Head Lice

Checking and treating children's hair for head lice is a parent/guardian responsibility. Schools may arrange head checks without prior permission from parents. Students found to be infested will be withdrawn from close contact with other children and will need to be collected quickly from school for treatment.

Permission for minor excursions

Activities that are part of our school's curriculum, such as visits to museums and parks, no longer require parent permission. Permission slips for individual excursions or activities are no longer sent home. However, you will still be informed prior to the excursion through our newsletter, student diary or other notice. If you do not want the student to participate, you will need to give written notice and state the reasons for withdrawing from the activity. Overnight excursions and activities that have an inherent risk will require a separate permission form.

Transporting the student in an emergency

In an emergency, the student will be moved to a safe place for appropriate care. This may be by ambulance or other form of transportation so that the student may be provided with appropriate care or treatment. Transportation costs are the responsibility of the person signing the enrolment form.

H1N1 Influenza 09 (Swine Flu) Vaccine Update

Dear parents and carers

As the school year begins I want to remind you all of the swine flu vaccine and its importance in protecting your child and your family.

The vaccine gives protection against the swine flu virus - which we expect to be the main form of flu again this year.

In 2009 we learned a lot about the virus:

- for most it causes a mild illness, with symptoms similar to other flus. For some it can cause serious illness or even death.
- · we can't always predict who will get seriously ill.
- young people and children were found to be at higher risk of illness.
- one third of all people who became seriously ill or died from sine flu were previously healthy.

Adult and child doses of the free swine flu vaccine are available now.

As with the seasonal flu vaccine, children aged less than 10 years of age need two doses of the vaccine given at least 28 days apart. People aged more than 10 years need one dose.

Children aged less than 6 months can not receive any flu vaccine. Vaccinating those around them, including parents and carers, brothers and sisters, is vital for their protection.

Where your family can be vaccinated

The vaccine is available from GPs and via most local government vaccination clinics. In addition during the next few weeks there will be a range of free community vaccination clinics in most areas.
